## **Questions for How To Share Christ wk3**

- Pastor Keith talked about how to start a spiritual conversation. Do you have a way that you like to steer things to spiritual matters? If so, please share.
- Does it matter if you are introverted or extroverted for sharing Christ with others?
  - Do you ever wish you were more of one or the other (introvert wishing they were extroverted, or visa versa)?
  - How can God use you within the makeup He gave you to share Christ with those around you?
- Pastor Keith gave examples of a variety of methods for bringing up Christ:
  - A direct method in which you bring up a question based on what you see in the person, or out of your own life experience
  - An indirect method on which you seek to open a door by speaking of your faith, and look to see if the person desires to converse more on the subject.
    - Under this method, Pastor Keith gave several categories of indirect topics: hobbies and spare time, nature, sports, shared struggles, et. al.
  - There is also the invitational method of inviting them to an event
- Which method seems most in line with who you are?
- Pastor Keith also talked about the need to use questions to lead people to truth, and to use stories that point truth out.
  - This is a part of a postmodern generation that we are trying to reach.
  - What stories in the Bible can you think of that might be well used in sharing Christ?
- Take some time now to share a person or persons that you would like to share Christ with. Think about who that person is. As a group, generate some questions that you might use to bring Christ into the conversation, as well as some Bible stories that might fit specific situations. Help each other out in your given situations by sharing the load of coming up with a loving approach to sharing Christ.
- Now, take time and pray.
  - Pray for the people you have mentioned you want to share Christ with.
  - Pray for the people in your group that will be sharing Christ.
  - Ask God for opportunity, for words, for strength and wisdom as conversations develop.
- Do not let this be a one event night! Consider setting aside time each week to check on progress. Celebrate even baby steps that a person may take in sharing Christ, and for those we are seeking to win to Christ.
- Make prayer for sharing Christ a regular activity in your group.
